ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE B

Measure B simply preserves the status quo, by extending the life of the County ordinance currently in effect. Measure B would continue to allow the cultivation of a reasonable amount of Cannabis on your land. Measure B looks to the future, rather than living in the past. Cannabis is fully legal in Colorado and Washington and is presently on the ballot in Oregon, where it is ahead in the polls. The New York Times recently published an editorial urging Congress to legalize Cannabis.

Measure B would allow qualified patients to legally obtain the medication they need, by allowing a sufficient supply of medical cannabis to be grown within the County. Many people with serious illnesses do not smoke Cannabis, they must eat large amounts of medical cannabis or apply cannabis oil to their skin, for example, to treat skin cancer.

Cannabis provides undeniable medical benefits to a large number of people. Scientific research has proven Cannabis shrinks cancerous tumors, slows down Alzheimers, reduces pain, slows weight loss associated with AIDS, and reduces the nausea and vomiting associated with chemotherapy. Cannabis is now also now being successfully used to treat other serious illnesses such as epilepsy and Multiple Sclerosis. Many people with serious illnesses cannot tolerate prescription drug side effects.

Measure B would allow selective plant breeding for development of specialized strains to continue. The Government is not conducting this research. Neither are drug companies. It is being left to private individuals.

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ARGUMENT AGAINST MEASURE B

REBUTTAL TO ARGUMENT AGAINST MEASURE B

County officials want to scare you into voting against Measure B. They want you to believe that Measure B would change County policies that regulate the cultivation of medical Cannabis. Measure B is Exactly The Same as the existing County Medical Cannabis cultivation ordinance. Hence, Measure B would continue existing County policy regulating cultivation of medical Cannabis. That existing policy was written by a Committee which included the sheriff and the D.A.

Measure B would Not remove local control. Measure B would simply put local control into the hands of the voters. The Board of Supervisors have already proven they can't be trusted, by resorting to extremism (Measure A).

The existing Cannabis cultivation ordinance protects residential neighborhoods, by requiring an approved, occupied home and an approved well on each parcel on which Medical Cannabis is grown. The existing Cannabis cultivation ordinance also has a one-year residency requirement. Measure B would continue all of these requirements.

The amount of water used to grow Medical Cannabis plants in the County is very small, compared to the amount of water used to grow most commercial crops. Your water supply is not and will not be threatened by Medical Cannabis cultivation conducted pursuant to Measure B.

Local Medical Cannabis growers are not causing local drug crimes. Prohibition is causing drug crimes. Measure B, by providing an adequate local supply of Medical Cannabis, will actually reduce local drug crimes over time.
